

BEST PRACTICES

❖ 1. TITLE OF THE PRACTICE: Helping Hands (Home for Destitute Blind - Kerala Federation of the Blind & Grace Palliative Care)

Our institution extends a helping hand to patients on their journey through illness, aiming to alleviate suffering and ensure dignity, comfort, and a sense of control. Healthcare practitioners focus on improving the quality of life for individuals with serious illnesses. The departments of the KMCT College of Allied Health Sciences have collaborated with Grace Palliative Care and the Kerala Federation of the Blind to provide training for our institute's interns.

2. OBJECTIVES OF THE PRACTICE:

- 1. Encompass an integrated approach that addresses needs on all levels, going beyond simple medical care.
- 2. Help patients maintain independence, engage in joyful activities, and have meaningful interactions with loved ones.
- 3. Aid patients in receiving primary healthcare and avoid unnecessary hospitalization.
- 4. Keep lines of communication open with families to enable educated decisions and future planning.

3. THE CONTEXT:

- 1. Help is provided at any stage of illness, regardless of its curability.
- 2. Provide dignity and support to patients and their families, enabling independent decision-making during challenging times.
- 3. Regular volunteer assistance is required, and a team must be organized with empathy and a sense of humanity.













4. THE PRACTICE:

Interns from our institute's department participate in a rotational training program at the Kerala Federation of the Blind (KFB) and Grace Palliative Care. Each batch of interns spends one week at a time at KFB and Grace, with 3-4 interns in each batch. This mandatory seven-day posting allows interns to engage in both inpatient and outpatient activities at the palliative center. A resource person from the institute monitors and guides the interns at the center. In the outpatient area, interns provide necessary measures and instructions under the supervision of the palliative team. During inpatient sessions, they monitor and assess the patient's condition. Additionally, interns conduct one home visit per week for terminally ill patients.

5. EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS:

Students who receive palliative care training are better equipped to address the challenges faced by patients with serious illnesses. Effective communication with patients and their families is emphasized. This posting section encourages collaboration and fosters a more holistic and patient-centered care environment.

6. PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED:

In the initial stages of the posting, there were misunderstandings from both students and patients/families. Students were initially unable to make their point, but with the help of the palliative team members, the problems were resolved.











❖ 2. TITLE OF THE PRACTICE: Differently Abled (Pratheeksha & Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development Rehabilitation and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities - CRC)

To embrace and empower differently abled individuals, promoting inclusivity, dispelling myths, and providing equal opportunities, KMCT CAHS, in collaboration with Pratheeksha and CRC, imparts various skills to enable them to carry out daily tasks independently. This fosters self-acceptance within the family and society, assisting them in achieving self-sufficiency.

OBJECTIVES OF THE PRACTICE:

- 1. Provide support services to help individuals develop their skills and achieve their goals.
- 2. Encourage self-advocacy to empower differently abled individuals to express their needs and advocate for themselves.
- 3. Promote positive attitudes that focus on abilities rather than disabilities.
- 4. Provide training in various fields to equip them with knowledge and skills.

THE CONTEXT:

- 1. Conduct needs assessments to identify disabilities and challenges faced by the target group.
- 2. Focus on developing life skills, social skills, and communication skills of the patients.
- 3. Adopt a patient and empathetic teaching approach that encourages participation and builds confidence.
- 4. Create individual education plans for each participant, outlining their learning goals, strengths, challenges, and required support equipment.
- 5. Involve patients' family members and caregivers in the training process.













THE PRACTICE:

Interns from our institution participate in a rotational training program at the center. These training programs help them develop specific vocational skills and enhance their overall quality of life. Empowering them with knowledge for better practices in their daily lives is a crucial step towards long-term health improvement.

They are better prepared to handle challenges encountered during the training period, enhancing their ability to choose, recognize, and provide efficient training approaches. WHEREAS, both parties consider the promotion and support of teaching, research and community outreach to be of primary importance in the fulfillment of their mission, goals, and objectives;

WHEREAS both institutions consider that increasing opportunities for mutual cooperation and exchange increases opportunities for further understanding and appreciation in related fields;

NOW, THEREFORE KMCT College of Allied Health Sciences and Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development Rehabilitation and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Kozhikode under DEPwD, MSJE, Govt. of India (hereafter CRC-K), agree to promote mutual cooperation in education and rehabilitation activites according to the following clauses:

FOURTH: All cooperative activities associated with academic courses and programs must be consistent with the accreditation requirements of both institutions. Consistency with accreditation principles will be included in all Specific Agreements associated with the implementation of academic course and other programs. This inter-institutional MoU does not imply the extension of accreditation from one institution to the other.

FIFTH: Any student, academic personnel, faculty or scholar exchanges, associated with this MoUmust comply with all the legal and administrative requirements, of the home and host institution. The specific requirements for the visits, as well as the financial implications for each institution must be approved in writing by duly authorized personnel at each institution. The above reference exchanges must be established through a separate Specific Agreement.

SIXTH: Each party will designate its own personnel to administer the activities associated with this MoU, as well as the development and implementation of any Specific Agreement. The personnel designated by each party to implement activities that arise from this agreement must hold current employment with the institution, and will be solely responsible to the institution to which it is employed. For CRC-K, Mr. Binoy Mathew K. V, Lecturer-Physiotherapy, CRC. Kothikode shall serve as liaison officer in collaboration with KMCT College of Allied Health Sciences. For KMCT College of Allied Health Sciences, Prof. Dr. Santheep S, shall serve as liaison officer to facilitate communication and exchange. Any changes shall be communicated to the partner institute promptly.

SEVENTH: The parties may, jointly or separately, endeavor to obtain financial resources from other institutions, government agencies and national and international organizations for the development of activities associated with the implementation of any Specific Agreement.

EIGHTH: The present MoUwill become valid upon signature by both parties and shall remain in effect for a period of three years from its effective date. It will be automatically extended by periods of two years unless either party informs the other party in writing three months before expiry that it does not seek an extension. The agreement may be amended at any time by a written agreement signed by authorized representatives of both parties.

NINTH: This MoUmay be terminated by either party upon three [3] months prior written notice to the other party; however, termination shall not affect the implementation of activities that have already commenced, pursuant to a Specific Agreement. Those Specific Agreements will remain in effect until the required associated activities are completed.
